Lady Falcons win fall tourney

The Shaw Lady Falcons ended their fall softball season on a positive note Oct. 15 by winning the Sumter Parks and Recreation Fall League Tournament. The team got revenge on the regular season champion, Wheeler's Landscaping, 8 - 6.

Shaw got into the championship game by beating Moore's Law Firm 11 - 7 and Wheeler's 16 - 6 earlier in the tourney.

Against Moore's, Shaw had a 15-hit attack led by Rebecca Long, Tina Lane, Jennifer Osborn, Jollene Blanding, Shamekia Toliver and Jeannine Hattig. Outfielder Joyce

Washington, who later filled in for an injured Tisha Heard at shortstop, provided stellar defense.

Against Wheeler's in the first meeting, Shaw flexed their muscles with a 19-hit barrage led by Long, Naquitta "Fred" Manning, Heard, Diana "Send 'em Dee" Fludd, Brittany Kleiss and La-Tecia Harrison. Fundamental defensive play led by Michelle Miller loomed large in stopping Wheeler's from getting any type of momentum.

In the championship game, Joyce Washington broke out of her hitting slump by going three for four at the plate.

Washington, Manning, and Long combined for eight of the team's 12 hits. A first-inning, two-run single by Lane got the scoring started. A five-run third inning, led by a bases-clearing double by Manning, and a sacrifice fly by Manning in the seventh proved to be enough to hold off a tough opponent in Wheeler's.
