SUBJECT: Seventh Renewed Declaration of a Public Health Emergency

1. Based on the Public Health Emergency Officer's (PHEO) recommendations about the continued threat to our installation from the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) and considering the most current information provided by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, IAW AFI 10-2519, *Public Health Emergencies and Incidents of Public Health Concern*, I hereby renew 20 FW/CC's *Declaration of a Public Health Emergency*, dated 17 March 2020; as renewed by the *Renewed Declaration of a Public Health Emergency*, dated 15 April 2020, the *Second Renewed Declaration of a Public Health Emergency*, dated 13 May 2020, the *Third Renewed Declaration of a Public Health Emergency*, dated 10 November 2020, the *Fourth Renewed Declaration of a Public Health Emergency*, dated 3 February 2021 and the *Sixth Renewed Declaration of a Public Health Emergency*, dated 3 May 2021. This seventh renewed declaration will terminate automatically 90 days from the date of this memorandum unless it is renewed and re-reported, or terminated sooner by 20 FW/CC or a senior commander in the chain of command.

2. The installation PHEO and medical personnel are hereby directed to identify, confirm, and control this public health emergency utilizing all necessary means outlined in AFI 10-2519. To implement my direction, the PHEO may issue guidance that affects installation personnel and property, and other individuals working, residing, or visiting this installation (e.g., closing base facilities, restricting movement, or implementing quarantine for select individuals).

3. The installation command and the PHEO will coordinate activities and share information with State, local, tribal and territorial officials responsible for public health and public safety to ensure our response is appropriate for the public health emergency. Shared information may include personally identifiable health information only to the extent necessary to protect public health and safety.

4. Violations of this order and any order issued pursuant to the public health emergency can result in discipline under the Uniform Code of Military Justice, applicable federal law and/or Air Force Instructions.
